DeCA Coupon Scanning Upgrade

A recent upgrade to the Defense Commissary Agency cashier computer system allows scanners to automatically compare coupons presented against products purchased for matches. This new system eliminates the need for cashiers to visually match coupons to products; the computer does it much faster and more efficiently. Coupons are accepted only up to six months past expiration dates and for only the exact products for which they apply. For example, if a coupon is for "brand name soup, 16 oz, dry mix" but the scanned item is "brand name soup, 10 oz, canned," this coupon will be refused.
