Panzer Bowling Center opening soon; Kelley facility to close

As the Stuttgart military community prepares for the Nov. 4 grand opening of the Panzer Bowling Center, operations are drawing to a close at the bowling house on Kelley Barracks. With one of the finest centers in Europe opening soon on nearby Panzer Kaserne, the Kelley Bowling Center will close Oct. 30 to prepare for its eventual transition into a multi-purpose facility. The facility will be open regular hours through Oct. 2, then open only on Fridays and Saturdays through the end of October.

After its Nov. 4 opening-day extravaganza, the Panzer Bowling Center will be open Sundays to Thursdays, 11 a.m. to 10 p.m., and Fridays and Saturdays, 11 a.m. to 1 a.m. The bar/lounge in the Panzer Center will be open every day from 4:30 p.m. to close. The snack bar will open Sundays to Thursdays 11 am to 9 pm and Fridays and Saturdays 11 am to midnight.

Featuring a kids' playground, snack bar and the always popular weekly Cosmic Bowling, the Panzer Center promises to be the place to be for league play, organization parties, holiday celebrations and much more.

Driving Government Vehicles

To drive a U.S. government vehicle, one must have a valid U.S. Army, Europe, privately owned vehicle license and a government vehicle license. One must pass the USAREUR written test, get a POV license, and then obtain a government vehicle driver's license through the sponsoring office. Medical Emergency Information

Do not call or report to the Stuttgart Health Clinic for emergencies. It is not staffed or equipped to handle these situations. True emergencies, which may require ambulance service, include heart attack, poisoning, severe bleeding, unconsciousness, breathing difficulty or severe injury to the head or torso.

If a true emergency exists, on or off post, call the military police at 116/civ. 0711-680-116 and provide the patient's name, age, sex, nature of emergency, your telephone number and location, including installation, street, building, apartment and room number. Stay on the line until instructed to hang up.

The German Red Cross (DRK) provides ambulance service to the Stuttgart military community; the Stuttgart Health Clinic has no ambulances. The DRK should be used for only

genuine emergencies to prevent loss of life, limb or vision or to limit undue suffering.

Report Suspicious Packages

Community members should be aware of suspicious mail and packages. Characteristics for which to look include an unusual or unknown place of origin, no return address, an excessive amount of postage, threatening messages, an abnormal or unusual size, oily stains or powder, incorrect spelling of common words, differing return address and postmarks and peculiar odors such as almond, dried grass or peach.

Never touch or move a suspicious package or letter, and wash hands if you suspect the package might be contaminated. Immediately report incidents by calling the Stuttgart Military Police Desk at 430-5262/5261/civ. 0711-680-5262/5261.

SOFA Stamps Required

Family members of active duty service members stationed in Germany are required to have a new blue Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) certificate or SOFA stamp from Washington D.C. in their no-fee passport NLT 15 Jan 2005.
