MEMORANDUM FOR ALL USAG Stuttgart Personnel

SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #41, Quiet Hours Policy

1. REFERENCE:

- a. USAG Stuttgart, Residents Handbook, 01 Mar 2015.
- b. AR 420-1, Army Facilities Management, 19 Feb 2008.

2. PURPOSE: To establish a "Quiet Hours" policy within the USAG Stuttgart.

3. APPLICABILITY: This policy applies to all personnel who live and work on USAG Stuttgart installations and their authorized guests.

4. GENERAL: In order to allow a full range of activities to all residents while at the same time guaranteeing a peaceful environment for our neighbors and ourselves, residents are required to observe and adhere to the quiet hours policy. All loud and disturbing noises, to include skateboarding, inline skating, and playground activities, will cease between 2100 hrs and 0800 hrs from Sunday to Thursday. On Friday and Saturdays, quiet hours will be observed from 2200 hrs to 0700 hrs. Though the above times and days have been established as "Quiet Hours", it does not imply that noise restriction are non-existent during other times of the day. Excessive noise that disturbs neighbors is prohibited at all times.

5. DEFINITION OF LOUD AND DISTURBING NOISE:

a. Family Housing and Single Soldier Quarters: Noise such as shouting, stomping, jumping, running, television and music played loud enough to be heard by neighbors and/or by persons walking outside the quarters/barracks room.

b. Vehicles: Running engines and/or music loud enough to be heard by an adjacent vehicle, pedestrians or residents in quarters when windows are open. Over sensitive car alarms frequently activated by surrounding motion and/or noise will be considered a nuisance.

6. Residents are reminded of their responsibility to monitor closely the activities of their children and guests. The determination of what is "loud and disturbing noise" is subjective in nature and will therefore be defined initially by the person who is disturbed. In these cases, residents are encouraged to contract their respective building coordinator to resolve noise problems. As a last resort, residents should contact the Military Police and the Housing office to lodge complaints and to seek resolution.

7. This policy memorandum supersedes all other "Quiet Hours" Policies.
