Residing within the USAG Stuttgart Area of Responsibility

SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #56 Ammunition and Explosives  
(A&E) Amnesty Program

1. **References.**

2. **Purpose.** To ensure personnel safety and the maximum recovery of military A&E items outside the supply system.

3. **Prohibitions.** *This paragraph is punitive.* The Amnesty Program is not intended to circumvent normal turn-in procedures, but to provide an opportunity for individuals to return found, stolen (by another individual), or misplaced A&E without fear of adverse action. Individuals who intentionally remove DoD-owned ammunition or explosives from the training area or unit arms room without command approval are subject to adverse action under the UCMJ.

4. **Applicability.** All personnel assigned to the Stuttgart Military community.

5. **Policy.**

- a. Small arms ammunition, up to and including .50 caliber, is eligible to be returned to military control through the Amnesty Program.

b. All other A&E will be considered hazardous, and will be handled only by trained and qualified explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) personnel after coordination with the Military Police.

**6. Responsibilities.**

**a. The Safety Office.**

(1) Ensure all unit Amnesty policies comply with regulations.

(2) Publicize the Garrison Amnesty Program, to include turn-in points.

(3) Provide training twice a year, and before any operation, exercise, or training event that involves A&E.


(4) Monitor the Amnesty Program to ensure units do not abuse the Program in lieu of proper turn-in procedures.

(5) Establish an annual amnesty turn-in day that will be widely publicized throughout the Garrison.

b. **USAG Stuttgart Provost Marshall Office.** Maintain a 24-hour amnesty turn-in procedure IAW the References.

c. **Tenant Units That Use or Expend A&E.** Establish and implement a unit A&E Amnesty Program SOP IAW the References, and submit the proposal to the Safety Office for Garrison Commander approval. Unit Amnesty Programs shall not intimidate or prevent individuals from freely turning in ammunition.
