SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter # 47, Preventing Family Violence and Domestic Abuse


1. Reference: AR 608-18, The Army Family Advocacy Program, 30 Oct 07.
2. Applicability: All service members, Department of Defense civilians, retirees, contractors, and their family members residing in the USAG Stuttgart military community.
3. Purpose: To outline the USAG Stuttgart policy of family violence.
4. Overview:
 - a. This command is committed to the goal of maintaining a safe and secure environment for all members of the community. Family violence in the form of domestic and child abuse detracts from the goal specifically and from readiness in general. The chain of command shares specific responsibilities in dealing with family violence. The rights of victims and perpetrators will be addressed in accordance with the reference.
 - b. The foundation of the Family Advocacy Program (FAP) is to improve readiness and retention. The four pillars to accomplish this objective are prevention, education, wellness, and treatment through programs designed to stop family violence. For service members involved in family violence, it is essential that treatment is completed, commanders should direct that his or her place of duty is at the scheduled appointments.
 - c. A very important factor is to understand the program designed for prevention and treatment outlined in the reference. The regulation highlights the requirement for mandatory briefing for commanders, within 90 days after assumption of command. Additionally, FAP is required to provide an annual education brief for all Soldiers related to the dynamics of spouse and child abuse and the availability of prevention and treatment services. Contact the FAP Manager at Army Community Service (ACS) at DSN 431-3352/3362 to coordinate training.
 - d. Equally important is the requirement for command representation at the Case Review Committee (CRC) in order to be aware of treatment recommendations.
